# Report on the Roundtable "Progress in Achieving SDG 1 – No Poverty" at the Uzbekistan State World Languages University (UzSWLU)

Date: November 15, 2022

Location: Conference Hall, UzSWLU

**Participants:** Representatives from academia, government officials, NGOs, students, and faculty

members.

On November 15, 2022, the Uzbekistan State World Languages University (UzSWLU) organized a roundtable titled "Progress in Achieving Sustainable Development Goal 1 (SDG 1) – No Poverty." The event brought together a diverse group of participants to discuss achievements and strategies aimed at reducing poverty in Uzbekistan. As the university's rector, Ulugbek Azizov, stated: "Education is a key tool in the fight against poverty, and our university actively supports and develops initiatives aimed at improving the quality of life for our communities."

## **Objectives of the Event**

The purpose of this roundtable was to create a platform for sharing experiences and generating recommendations to reduce poverty in Uzbekistan. Key goals included:

## 2. Social Support and Protection Systems

• Representatives from the Ministry of Labor and Social Protection presented current social support programs and emphasized that achieving SDG 1 requires access to social resources and support for vulnerable groups. "We need to create a system where every citizen of Uzbekistan feels protected and has the opportunity to improve their wellbeing," stated a ministry representative.

### 3. The Role of NGOs and International Cooperation

• The importance of collaboration with NGOs and international partners in achieving sustainable development goals was highlighted. An NGO representative remarked: "Only through joint efforts can we create an environment where everyone has the opportunity to overcome hardships and reach prosperity."

### 4. Climate Resilience and Poverty

• Participants discussed the impact of climate change on poverty levels and the need for sustainable solutions. A representative from the Environmental Committee stressed: "Climate change affects the most vulnerable populations, and we must take measures to adapt and protect these groups."

#### **Outcomes and Recommendations**

Based on the discussions, the following recommendations were developed:

- **Expand educational programs** for low-income groups, focusing on skill development and employment opportunities.
- **Strengthen social support** by developing a more accessible and flexible social protection system, especially for rural and remote areas.
- Collaborate with NGOs and international partners to implement programs aimed at improving living conditions.
- Enhance climate resilience to minimize its impact on vulnerable populations.

#### Conclusion

The roundtable concluded with an agreement to hold similar meetings to monitor progress in achieving SDG 1 and to develop new joint programs. UzSWLU reaffirms its commitment to addressing poverty issues and will continue to work with partners to improve wellbeing in Uzbekistan.
