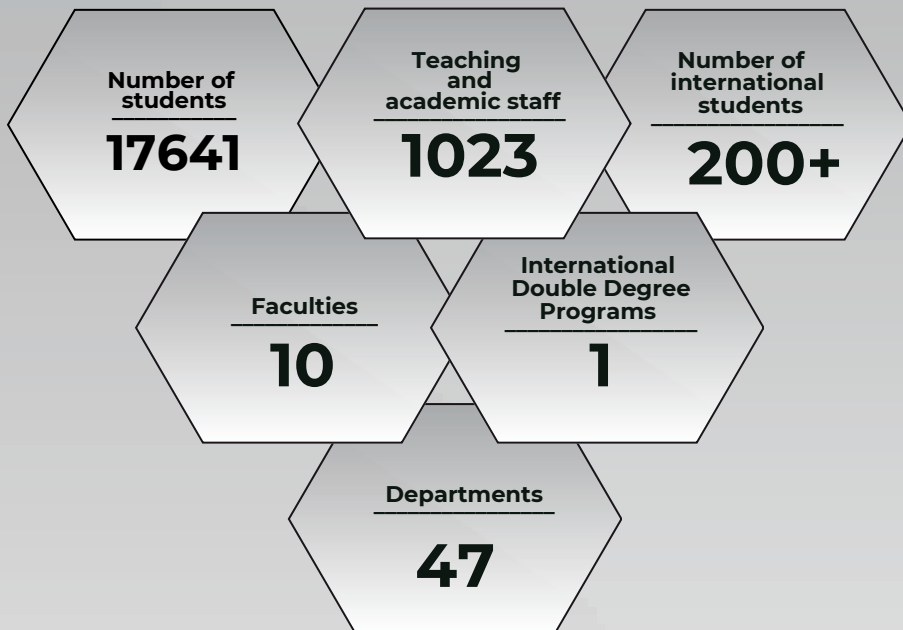

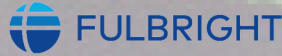
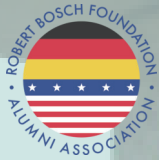

Visiting Student Program

Uzbekistan State World Languages University (UzSWLU) Visiting program is designed for international students who would like to study at UzSWLU for up to 2 semesters with other UzSWLU and international students. Visiting student program applicants will be assessed on individual's academic ability. In order to apply for program, students should consult with a study abroad coordinator at their home university to secure approval.

GRADING SYSTEM



Grading System

The Grade point Average is weighted sum of the grade points earned, divided by the number of courses in which the grade points were earned. The cumulative grade point average, which normally appears at the end of a transcript, is based on all courses taken at UzSWLU for which grades have been assigned. Generally, individual courses are graded as follows:

General information about Postgraduate Education

Institute of Postgraduate Education-a system for the implementation of postgraduate education in higher educational institutions (hereinafter - HEI) or research institutions (hereinafter - NRU) in the form of basic doctoral studies, doctoral studies or independent competition.

Basic doctoral studies is a form of postgraduate education in the specialty of scientific and scientific-pedagogical personnel of the highest qualifications, organized at a higher education institution or national research university for applicants for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy (hereinafter - **PhD**) for in-depth study of the specialty and their conduct of scientific research in order to prepare and defense of a doctoral dissertation outside of work, financed from the State Budget of the Republic of Uzbekistan.

Doctoral studies is a form of postgraduate education in the specialty of scientific and scientific-pedagogical personnel of the highest qualification, organized at a higher education institution or national research university for applicants for the degree of Doctor of Science (Doctor of Science, hereinafter - **DSc**) for in-depth study of the specialty and their conduct of scientific research for the purpose of preparation and defense off-the-job doctoral dissertation, financed from the State Budget of the Republic of Uzbekistan.



General information about Postgraduate Education

Conditions created for researchers at UzSWLU

In order to timely defend a scientific dissertation, special conditions have been created for doctoral researchers: doctoral students at each level are provided with individually equipped premises, workstations; such sources as Web of Science, Scopus, Google Scholar, EBSCO, ProQuest and others are available for researchers to investigate and collect information needed.

Opening hours of doctorate school is from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., six days a week.

Our student dormitory is located on campus, just a few minutes' walk from the academic buildings and libraries. The dormitory is a modern facility offering comfortable living conditions for students of all years.

If you want to take part in higher-level competitive sports, virtually all universities have representative teams across a range of sports, where the teams have been picked to represent the uni. In representative sports, student teams take part in matches against other universities and often also participate in local leagues and other competitions.

If you're a member of a representative team, you can expect to play a couple of matches a week: one against another university and the other against a local sports club. You'll also have at least one training and/or coaching session.

These clubs and leagues are generally operated by students for students but are increasingly supported by permanent professional staff within the institutions.

SCIENTIFIC-METHODOLOGICAL ELECTRONIC JOURNAL “PHILOLOGY MATTERS”

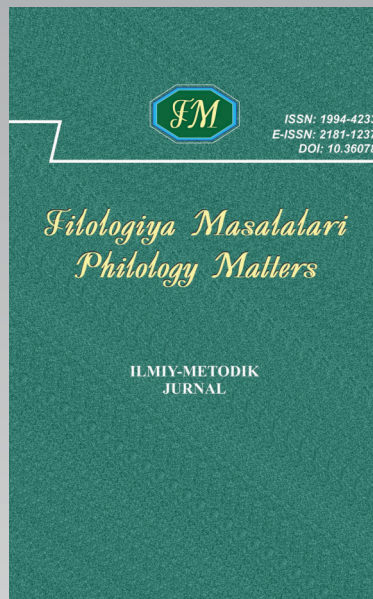
