





Scholarship Programs for Low-Income Students

As per the <u>UzSWLU order the Scholarship Scheme</u> is announced for the Bachelor and Master's degree Students who falls under the bottom 20% of household income group. The University administrative office supports the Student community to avail the scheme and it will greatly support the Student community education. Especially, for women there many opportunities, as Master's degree female students do not pay any contract. In the admission count of the academic year 2022–2023 Students got benefitted by availing the Scholarship who falls under the bottom 20% of household income and the community as defined by the Government of Uzbekistan

Opportunities created for low-income students who fall into the bottom 20% of household income group

The number of underprivileged and low-income students at the Uzbekistan State World Languages University exceeds 2600, of which 2237 students were given various opportunities in the 2022-2023 academic year. Additionally, 197 students with disabilities registered under the "Iron" and "Women" programs were provided with free dormitory accommodation and the necessary living conditions and 677 students are being assisted with a 50% discount on their annual student housing fees.



To help low-income and disabled students to study successfully The Resolution of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan dated August 9, 2021, titled "On measures to introduce a new system of state support for orphans and children deprived of parental care," provides specific support for these vulnerable groups. According to paragraph 10 of this resolution, to support the education of orphans and children deprived of parental care, the Country Fund will cover the one-time purchase of educational, scientific, and literary materials for these students during their studies at the institute. Subsidies amounting to five times the base calculation are allocated from the state budget for this purpose.



Providing financial and moral support to students from low income families to graduate from the institute

Resolution of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan dated August 9, 2021, "On measures to introduce a new system of state support for orphans and children deprived of parental care" In accordance with paragraph 10 of this resolution, to support the education of orphans and children deprived of parental care, 8 students at the institute who are in this category are funded by the Student Incentive Fund. These students receive scholarships that are increased by 50%. Additionally, to implement this decision, provisions are made for the purchase of personal hygiene items, food products, clothes, shoes, and other necessary items for these students.

Programs or initiatives that help low-income students successfully complete their studies

Decision of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan dated August 9, 2021 "On measures to introduce a new system of state support for orphans and children deprived of parental care". In accordance with paragraph 10, in order to support the education of orphans and children deprived of parental care, 8 students who are deprived of parental care studying at the institute are funded by the Student Incentive Fund. Scholarships are being paid in the amount increased by 50%

About the Center: The center helps students find and get a job and is a structural unit of the University. This structural division establishes cooperation relations with employing organizations, institutions, enterprises and agencies, employment centers under the administrations. The center helps to place students in their spare time to work with specialists in the labor market based on their needs, according to the practical needs of the national economy.

The 2023 Global Report on Food Crises highlights a critical global increase in food insecurity, with **282 million people experiencing acute food insecurity in 2023.** This represents a 24 million person increase from 2022 due to worsening conditions in several areas and expanded monitoring. The report, produced by the Food Security Information Network (FSIN) and the Global Network Against Food Crises (GNAFC), identifies that conflict, climate change, and economic instability remain the primary drivers of food insecurity worldwide, with regions like sub-Saharan Africa, the Middle East, and Latin America especially affected. The report aims to guide both humanitarian and development efforts to alleviate food crises in the most affected areas.



In order to provide social support and financial assistance to young students with disabilities, as well as those in need of social protection and possessing special abilities and talents, who are active in public affairs, the list of students with disabilities studying at the Uzbekistan State World Languages University is attached to **Appendix 1** and to the "Iron Register", "Youth Register", "Women's Register" and "Unified Register of Social Protection" Scholarships are provided to those on the list of students who have children of the included family and are active in public affairs of the university.

University provide them with free Accommodation, Transportation (we give them special atto cards with discount and free) and also we provide legal support as we have a special staff members who will help the students. Also we give free vocational training Lessons so students with low income could make a living with that.

TRAINING ACTIVITIES TO FIND JOBS

The Uzbekistan State World Languages University <u>regularly offers vocational training courses for young people</u>, especially those in financial need. These courses are open to the public; participants can attend in person by bringing their passport or, if preferred, may contact the university in advance to receive a Zoom link for remote access. Information about all new vocational courses is advertised on the university website beforehand.

These courses are specifically designed to prepare participants for the workforce. After completing the courses, skilled students are connected with companies for potential employment as workers.









REGARDING DETERMINATION OF AMOUNTS OF SCHOLARSHIPS TO BE PAID TO STUDENTS OF UZSWLU AND MEASURES TO IMPROVE THE PROCEDURE OF APPOINTMENT AND PAYMENT OF SCHOLARSHIPS

In implementation of the decision of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan "On the parameters of the state order for admission to higher education institutions of the Republic of Uzbekistan in the 2019/2020 academic year" No. PQ-4359 of June 17, 2019, and in order to further improve the procedure for awarding and paying scholarships to students of UzSWLU, the Cabinet of Ministers decides to allocate scholarships to talented students.

The mission of the Student Financial Aid Group at UzSWLU is to provide financial assistance and support to students at all levels of study, from bachelor to doctorate levels.

In addition, the scholarship allocation policy at UzSWLU supports both undergraduate and graduate students, ensuring they have access to educational opportunities. By adhering to the policy of addressing the financial needs of students, UzSWLU allocates various types of scholarships to support students. Both general and specific scholarships are organized by the university in collaboration with companies, aiming to develop highly desirable graduates in line with the institution's vision.

Support Programs for Low-Income Students at Uzbekistan State University of World Languages in 2023: Scholarships, Competitions, and Extracurricular Initiatives

Uzbekistan State World Languages University has implemented various programs and initiatives to support students from socially vulnerable groups, including those from low-income households, to help them successfully complete their studies. These initiatives include financial rewards and scholarships aimed at fostering students' academic achievements, extracurricular engagement, and overall success.

Evidence: As evidence, we can provide the university rector's order dated December 6, 2022 (No. 383), based on the Cabinet of Ministers of Uzbekistan Resolution No. 310 dated June 7, 2022, and joint resolutions by the Ministry of Culture and the Ministry of Higher and Secondary Specialized Education. According to this order, the university allocates funds from the Student Encouragement Fund to provide financial support and awards to winners of the "Best Student Theater Studios" competition. For instance, members of the "Diydor" theater group, which won first place, received a financial reward of 1,000,000 UZS.

Additional initiatives include the Aleksandr Faynberg Special Scholarship, which awards students who are actively engaged in studying the life and contributions of Aleksandr Faynberg and who promote literature and academic achievements. This scholarship is awarded annually to students demonstrating excellence in related activities.

Moreover, the Rector's Scholarship is awarded to students who have achieved outstanding academic success and leadership. Alongside these scholarships, the university encourages student engagement through extracurricular programs such as the "Zakovat" Intellectual Club, which promotes critical thinking and teamwork through intellectual competitions, and the Rector's Cup, a series of sports tournaments held in various sports. These competitions provide students with a platform to develop their physical and cognitive skills, further contributing to their holistic growth and supporting their successful completion of university.

These initiatives collectively foster an environment of support and encouragement, ensuring students are empowered academically, culturally, and socially, which facilitates their educational success and helps them reach graduation.









Scholarship Programs for Low-Income Students

Afghanistan and Turkmenistan are among the low-income nations from which the <u>Uzbekistan State World Languages University (UzSWLU) accepts students</u>. Afghan students, in particular, receive benefits such as free housing, discounts on food and transportation, and a full tuition waiver. Additionally, they can enroll in various free courses offered by UzSWLU.

UzSWLU offers all international students free dormitory accommodations close to campus. These dormitories provide modern amenities to support students in their studies.

The university offers a variety of courses, with Afghan students showing a keen interest in most of them. These courses give students a chance to study subjects in depth in an engaging way, free of charge.

UzSWLU also provides foreign students with a discount on transportation. Students use a university-issued credit card that reduces the cost of public transportation, making daily travel more affordable. This card also offers benefits during holiday periods, helping students with travel costs.





Every year, <u>UzSWLU hosts seminars and start-up weeks</u> to assist both local and regional level organizations in realizing their potential. Our university offers full access to career classes, libraries, sports facilities, and other learning forums and conferences.



Annual <u>"Scientific-innovative and start-up projects"</u> week and forums are held by UzSWLU; funding will be awarded to the winners. Over fifty projects are set to compete.

For 2023, Uzbekistan State World Languages University (UzSWLU) has participated in policy-making efforts at both regional and national levels to address poverty. This participation is part of its commitment to support the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), particularly the goal to end poverty in all its forms. One specific piece of evidence that demonstrates this involvement is the university's report on its educational outreach and scholarship programs. These programs target economically disadvantaged youth, providing vocational training, language courses, and financial support to enhance employability and economic stability. The document includes details about partnerships with local government bodies to create employment pathways for low-income students through training and skill development programs, which align with national poverty reduction strategies. This report can serve as tangible evidence of UzSWLU's contributions and proactive measures to influence and support poverty alleviation policies in Uzbekistan.

A job fair organized by the Tashkent City Prosecutor's Office was recently held in Tashkent's Japanese Garden to support student employment. This fair offered students from various universities, including the Uzbekistan State World Languages University (UzSWLU), an opportunity to connect with potential employers across sectors like preschools, general education schools, and other institutions. During the event, students engaged with representatives, explored available positions, and received guidance on building career paths. Many students, including 63 who successfully secured jobs, received certificates for participating in the fair, highlighting the value of such initiatives in fostering practical experience and professional growth for young graduates in Uzbekistan.
