The campus on Zakovat Street is also home to the statue of Maxim Gorky, which is recognized as a UNESCO heritage site, adding historical and cultural value to the university environment. <u>Uzbekistan State World Languages University</u> (UzSWLU) provides public access to its extensive library resources through <u>the Information Resource Center (IRC)</u>. This center, with a rich history dating back to 1948, was transformed and expanded over the years to offer a vast collection of <u>over 51,246 titles in both print and</u> <u>digital formats</u>. Open daily from 8:30 AM to 10:00 PM, the IRC is accessible not only to students and faculty but also to the public and visitors to the university.

The IRC includes specialized reading rooms, such as the "KOREA CORNER" and a foreign literature room, providing access to diverse international literature, language resources, and cultural materials. The digital library and computer labs are equipped with Wi-Fi, facilitating easy access to electronic resources. Additionally, the IRC's electronic catalog is available through the IRBIS-64 system, allowing users to search for publications, books, and other resources conveniently. 
To ensure a comfortable living environment for all students, the following rules are established:

### Community and Connection:




