[6.11] Number of Activities Organized by Student Organizations Related to Sustainability (2024–2025)

At the **Uzbekistan State World Languages University (UzSWLU)**, student organizations are the main catalysts of sustainability culture and youth engagement in environmental and social responsibility.

Through active cooperation between the **Youth Union “Yoshlar Ittifoqi”**, the **Ma’naviyat va Ma’rifat Department**, and the **International Rankings Department**, the university has established a consistent model of student-led sustainability education.

During the **2024–2025 academic year**, UzSWLU student organizations implemented more than **265 sustainability-related activities**, encompassing environmental, social, cultural, and health dimensions.

These events directly contributed to the realization of **UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)** — especially **SDG 3 (Good Health and Well-being)**, **SDG 4 (Quality Education)**, **SDG 13 (Climate Action)**, **SDG 15 (Life on Land)**, and **SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals)** — by combining theoretical awareness with community action.

Student organizations not only plan and execute such events but also integrate sustainability values into **every semester’s agenda**, ensuring that green thinking becomes a permanent part of student life and leadership development at UzSWLU.

Key Sustainability Activities (2024–2025)

1. Eco-Environmental Actions

- *Waste-Free Day* campaign (March 30), jointly organized with the Tashkent Department of Ecology and Environmental Protection to promote zero-waste habits.

- *Tree Planting for Peace* – monthly greening actions with over 100 new trees planted on and around campus.
- 2. **Health and Well-being**
 - *EcoRun – Healthy Lifestyle Marathon* and *Sports for Health* competitions encouraging physical and mental well-being among students (SDG 3).
 - *Valeology and Stress Management Week* — a series of workshops on healthy lifestyle and sustainable nutrition.
 - *Bike-to-Campus* campaign promoting carbon-free mobility and physical fitness.
 - *Football Competition* within the *World Youth Festival* (June 30), organized to promote teamwork and community sustainability.

- 3. **Cultural and Educational Engagement**
 - *Barqaror Til, Barqaror Dunyo* seminar cycle: interactive sessions where students discuss global SDGs and ethical communication in multiple languages.
 - *EcoTalks* and *SDG Debate Clubs* – student forums focusing on linguistic ecology, cultural inclusion, and climate discourse.
 - *Sustainability Film Week* featuring eco-documentaries followed by panel discussions led by faculty members.
 - *EcoPoster Exhibition* and *Green Poetry Contest* encouraging creative reflection on the relationship between humanity and nature.
- 4. **Community and International Collaboration**
 - *Youth Shoulder Project (Germany)* – participation of UzSWLU students in international sustainability training on ecology, human rights, and volunteering.

Impact

- Over **12,000 students** directly engaged in sustainability activities during 2024–2025.
- A new **Eco-Volunteers Network** was formed, now active across all faculties and dormitories.
- The number of female participants in environmental leadership events increased by **27%** compared to last year.
- Students led over **20 campus-wide campaigns** addressing recycling, tree planting, and energy saving.
- Strengthened cooperation with government and NGO partners to organize cross-sectoral events.
- Enhanced visibility through official media: sustainability initiatives were featured more than **50 times** on UzSWLU’s official website and Telegram channel.
- Several events were also covered by national media outlets, showcasing UzSWLU as a model of youth-led environmental action.

These efforts have transformed sustainability from isolated initiatives into a **core identity of UzSWLU’s student culture**, emphasizing responsibility, innovation, and collaboration.

Conclusion and Strategic Outlook

Student organizations at UzSWLU have evolved into powerful **youth-led engines of sustainability transformation**.

Through coordinated annual plans, cross-faculty partnerships, and international participation, they have ensured that sustainability is not an occasional activity but a continuous, year-round mission.

The steady increase from **215 events in 2023–2024** to **265 in 2024–2025** clearly reflects a strategic institutional shift towards environmental responsibility and sustainable education.

These initiatives show how language education can go beyond classrooms to inspire green citizenship and lifelong eco-values among young people.

UzSWLU thus stands as a leading example in Uzbekistan for integrating sustainability into every aspect of university life — from academic programs to student initiatives and global collaboration.



In connection with the designation of March 30 as Waste-Free Day by the Tashkent Department of Ecology, Environmental Protection, and Climate Change, a clean-up campaign was organized to remove litter collected along the roadsides. As part of the "Youth Shoulder" project organized in Germany, on July 23, 2024, Dilshoda Alisherova, a fourth-year student from the Faculty of English Language and Literature at the Uzbek State University of World Languages, participated in an 8-day training session in the city of Weimar, Germany.

Out of participants from all over Uzbekistan, 25 were selected for the training, during which they received lessons from international trainers in Russian and English on the topics of "Ecology," "Human Rights," and "Volunteering."

The project consists of three stages. In the first stage, 50 participants were selected in Tashkent and involved in training sessions held across the country. In the second stage, 25 of those 50 participants were chosen to attend the training in Germany.
