Message from the Rector



Dear colleagues, students, partners and friends,

The founding vision of Uzbekistan State World Languages University — to contribute to the development of society through excellence in language education, research, and international cooperation — continues to guide our institutional growth and strategic priorities. In 2024, the University community once again demonstrated that dedication, innovation, and collaboration can generate meaningful impact not only within the campus environment but also across the national and international academic landscape.

Throughout the year, our academic units continued to combine strong theoretical foundations with practical learning opportunities. Students actively participated in academic competitions, international educational initiatives, and creative projects that showcased their talent, global awareness, and professional potential. At the same time, the University celebrated new cohorts of graduates who are now contributing to diverse sectors including education, international relations, business, translation, diplomacy, and global communication.

Research and academic engagement remained central to the University's mission. Faculty members and researchers continued to contribute to scholarly dialogue through conferences, publications, and collaborative projects that address contemporary linguistic, cultural, and educational challenges. Our Scopus-indexed publications grew by 28% compared to the previous year, and our international research collaborations expanded across 19 countries.

Internationalisation remains one of the key pillars of the University's development strategy. In 2024, UzSWLU further strengthened its partnerships with leading universities, international organisations, and academic networks across 36 countries. These collaborations create valuable opportunities for student mobility, joint research, academic exchange, and the development of innovative educational programmes aligned with global standards.

I am particularly proud of our graduates' employment outcomes: 93% of our 2024 graduates secured employment within six months, with 92% of employers reporting high satisfaction with UzSWLU graduates' professional preparedness. These results confirm that our educational approach is producing competitive specialists ready for the global labour market. This report provides a comprehensive overview of the University's achievements and developments during the year, reflecting our ongoing commitment to academic excellence, international engagement, and the preparation of highly qualified specialists capable of contributing to the development of Uzbekistan and the global community.

Uzbekistan State World Languages University (UzSWLU) is one of the leading higher education institutions in Uzbekistan dedicated to advancing linguistic education, intercultural dialogue, and international cooperation. Established to train highly qualified specialists in foreign languages, translation, linguistics, and international communication, the University plays a significant role in supporting Uzbekistan's integration into the global academic and professional community.

The University operates under the national higher education system of the Republic of Uzbekistan and contributes to the development of multilingual competencies, global outlook, and professional expertise among its students. Through modern educational programmes, international academic partnerships, and research initiatives, UzSWLU seeks to strengthen the country's capacity in foreign language education and international engagement.

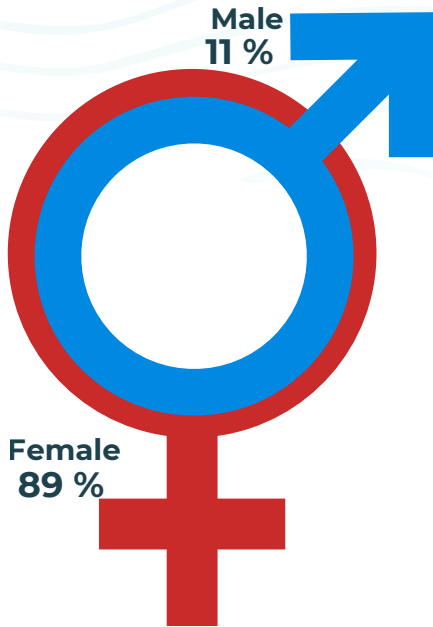

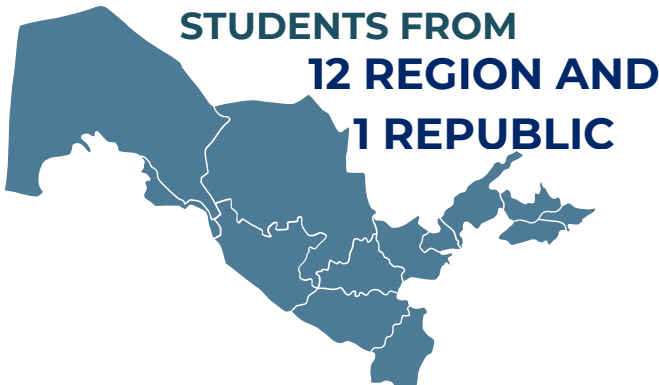

Academic Programmes

Uzbekistan State World Languages University offers a diverse portfolio of undergraduate academic programmes designed to prepare highly qualified specialists in the fields of foreign languages, linguistics, translation, international communication, and language pedagogy. The University currently comprises 9 faculties, delivering education across 26 undergraduate programmes and providing instruction in 22 foreign languages.

Through its academic structure, UzSWLU combines strong theoretical foundations with practical training aimed at developing advanced linguistic competence, intercultural communication skills, and professional expertise. The University's programmes integrate modern teaching methodologies, innovative educational technologies, and practice-oriented learning to ensure that graduates are well prepared for careers in education, translation, international relations, diplomacy, tourism, media, and other globally oriented sectors.

UzSWLU's multilingual academic environment plays a key role in fostering cross-cultural dialogue and international cooperation. By offering education in a wide range of languages and disciplines, the University contributes to the preparation of competitive specialists capable of engaging in global academic, professional, and cultural exchange.

Looking ahead, the University continues to strengthen its academic portfolio by expanding interdisciplinary programmes, integrating digital learning technologies, and enhancing collaboration with international partners to ensure that its educational programmes remain aligned with evolving global standards.

Student Achievements and Academic Engagement

Students of Uzbekistan State World Languages University continue to demonstrate notable achievements in academic, scientific, and cultural activities, reflecting the University's commitment to preparing highly qualified and globally competitive specialists in foreign languages and intercultural communication.

During the 2024–2025 academic year, students actively participated in academic initiatives, international conferences, exchange programmes, and cultural projects organised both within the University and in cooperation with international partners. These activities contribute to strengthening students' professional competencies, research skills, and global perspectives.

Participation in international academic mobility programmes remains an important component of student development. Through partnerships with foreign universities and international organisations, UzSWLU students regularly engage in exchange programmes, academic internships, and professional training abroad. Students and young researchers also contribute to the University's academic life through participation in international scientific and practical conferences, particularly in the fields of linguistics, translation studies, and intercultural communication.

Creative and cultural initiatives further enrich student life at the University. Literary events, translation competitions, and cultural programmes organised in cooperation with diplomatic missions and international organisations help students expand their cultural awareness and strengthen their ability to work effectively in multilingual and multicultural environments.

UzSWLU also takes pride in the outstanding achievements of its talented students in national and international competitions. During a University Council meeting, a ceremonial award event was organised to recognise these accomplishments. Among the notable achievements, Khaldurdyeva Oguljeren Abajan qizi, a student of the Faculty of English Philology, won the national stage of the prestigious "Young Reader" competition, receiving the Presidential Prize — a BYD Chazor electric vehicle — and a laptop awarded by the University.

UzSWLU students also achieved excellent results in the International English Language Olympiad organised by the Dovletmamet Azadi Turkmen National Institute of World Languages, securing one first place, one second place, and two third places. These accomplishments highlight the strong academic preparation of UzSWLU students and demonstrate the University's dedication to fostering academic excellence, intellectual development, and international competitiveness.

The Future of Teaching and Learning

Uzbekistan State World Languages University continues to strengthen the connection between academic learning and real-world professional experience. The University actively promotes innovative educational practices that enable students to develop both hard and soft skills through practical projects, creative initiatives, and collaboration with industry and international partners.

Throughout the academic year, the University organised a range of creative, cultural, and academic events that brought together students, scholars, and professionals from various fields. These initiatives encouraged interdisciplinary collaboration and provided a platform for students to explore the intersection of language, culture, media, and the arts. Through film screenings, literary discussions, exhibitions, and creative workshops, students were able to engage with contemporary cultural themes while developing their professional and creative competencies.

A key priority for the University is the continuous improvement of teaching and learning quality. Academic support units and methodological centres actively work to enhance pedagogical practices, strengthen faculty development, and introduce innovative teaching methodologies. Special attention is given to professional development programmes for instructors, focusing on modern teaching strategies, curriculum design, and student-centred learning approaches.

Digital transformation in education also remains an important area of development. The University continues to expand the use of digital learning platforms, online course design, and modern educational technologies in order to support flexible and effective learning environments. Initiatives aimed at integrating emerging technologies, including artificial intelligence in education, are gradually being explored to improve both teaching practices and student learning experiences.

Collaboration with international universities and academic organisations plays an important role in strengthening the University's educational ecosystem. Through joint academic initiatives, professional training programmes, and international conferences on teaching and learning, UzSWLU continues to expand opportunities for knowledge exchange and academic cooperation.

These efforts reflect the University's ongoing commitment to fostering an innovative, collaborative, and future-oriented educational environment, where teaching excellence, creativity, and global engagement support the preparation of highly qualified specialists for the modern world.



Career Development, Mobility and Alumni Engagement

Uzbekistan State World Languages University places strong emphasis on linking academic education with professional development and international engagement. Through career development initiatives, internship opportunities, and global academic partnerships, the University supports students in gaining practical experience and preparing for successful careers in international and multilingual environments. The University currently educates over 19,000 students, including 18,173 undergraduate students and 1,065 graduate students, creating a dynamic academic community that promotes intellectual growth and professional development. UzSWLU also maintains a growing international dimension, with more than 400 international students and 114 international faculty members, strengthening the University's multicultural academic environment.

International academic mobility is an important element of student development at UzSWLU. Each year, students participate in exchange programmes and academic mobility initiatives through partnerships with foreign universities. According to the latest academic statistics, 102 international exchange students studied at UzSWLU, while 132 UzSWLU students participated in outbound exchange programmes, gaining valuable international learning experience.

The University offers a diverse academic portfolio consisting of 24 undergraduate degree programmes and 28 postgraduate programmes, ensuring comprehensive educational opportunities across language studies, linguistics, translation, intercultural communication, and related disciplines. High levels of academic continuity are reflected in the University's 98% student continuation and retention rate, demonstrating the effectiveness of its academic support system and student engagement strategies.

UzSWLU also continues to strengthen connections between students, alumni, and employers through professional networking events, academic partnerships, and international cooperation projects. Many graduates pursue careers in education, translation, international organisations, diplomacy, tourism, and global communication, while others continue their academic journey through postgraduate study.

Through these initiatives, Uzbekistan State World Languages University continues to foster a strong ecosystem that integrates education, professional development, and international cooperation, preparing graduates who are well equipped to contribute to both national development and the global academic and professional community.



Student Exchanges and International Mobility

International academic mobility is an important component of the educational experience at Uzbekistan State World Languages University. Through cooperation with foreign universities and international educational organisations, UzSWLU actively promotes student exchange programmes that enhance intercultural understanding, academic collaboration, and global learning opportunities.

Each year, UzSWLU students participate in a variety of international exchange and academic mobility programmes, studying abroad for short-term training, semester exchanges, and international academic projects. According to recent institutional statistics, 132 UzSWLU students participated in outbound exchange programmes, gaining valuable international academic experience and strengthening their intercultural competencies.

At the same time, the University continues to welcome students from partner institutions around the world. During the reporting period, 102 inbound exchange students studied at UzSWLU, participating in language courses, intercultural communication programmes, and academic activities organised by the University.

These exchange programmes provide students with the opportunity to experience different academic environments, develop global perspectives, and engage in collaborative learning with peers from diverse cultural backgrounds. Digital technologies also play an increasing role in supporting international cooperation, enabling universities to organise joint courses, virtual exchange initiatives, and collaborative academic projects across borders.

Through these initiatives, Uzbekistan State World Languages University continues to expand its international academic network while strengthening its position as a centre for multilingual education and global academic cooperation.

Alumni Contribution and Professional Impact

Graduates of Uzbekistan State World Languages University continue to make significant contributions across a wide range of professional sectors both nationally and internationally. The University's alumni network reflects the strong academic foundation and multilingual competencies developed during their studies, enabling graduates to pursue successful careers in diverse professional environments.

Many UzSWLU alumni work in government institutions, international organisations, diplomatic missions, educational institutions, and private companies, where their expertise in foreign languages, translation, intercultural communication, and international relations plays an important role in strengthening international cooperation and cultural dialogue.

A considerable number of graduates pursue careers in the education sector, working as language instructors, researchers, translators, and academic specialists in universities and educational institutions. Others contribute to the activities of international organisations, development programmes, and diplomatic institutions, where multilingual skills and intercultural competencies are highly valued.

UzSWLU alumni are also actively engaged in the corporate and service sectors, including tourism, media, international trade, and global communication services. In addition, some graduates demonstrate strong entrepreneurial initiative, establishing language centres, translation agencies, educational platforms, and consulting services.

The University regularly organises career development initiatives and job fairs that bring together students, graduates, government agencies, international organisations, and private sector partners. These events create valuable opportunities for professional networking and employment, supporting students and alumni in successfully entering the labour market.



Research Publications and Academic Conferences

Research and academic activity play an important role in strengthening the scientific potential and international reputation of Uzbekistan State World Languages University (UzSWLU). The University actively promotes scholarly research, international collaboration, and participation in academic conferences, contributing to the development of linguistics, education, translation studies, and interdisciplinary research. According to international scientific databases, researchers affiliated with UzSWLU have produced 233 scholarly publications authored by 176 researchers, reflecting the growing contribution of the University to global academic discourse.

The distribution of publications demonstrates the interdisciplinary nature of the University's research activity. The largest share of publications is concentrated in Social Sciences, which accounts for approximately 17.8% of the total research output. Other significant research areas include Engineering (14.8%), Computer Science (14.0%), Environmental Science (10.8%), and Energy Studies (9.1%). Additional contributions are observed in Arts and Humanities, Agricultural and Biological Sciences, Business and Management, Earth and Planetary Sciences, and Biochemistry and Molecular Biology, highlighting the expanding research interests of the University's academic community.

UzSWLU scholars regularly participate in international scientific conferences, research workshops, and academic forums, where they present research results, exchange ideas with international experts, and establish new academic partnerships. These events provide an important platform for strengthening collaboration with foreign universities and research institutions.

In addition to conference participation, the University actively supports research projects, academic publications, and interdisciplinary studies that address contemporary social, cultural, linguistic, and technological challenges. Faculty members and researchers continue to publish in reputable international journals and contribute to the advancement of knowledge in language education, intercultural communication, and related fields.

Through these efforts, Uzbekistan State World Languages University continues to strengthen its role as a leading academic institution contributing to research development, international academic cooperation, and the global exchange of knowledge.



Research Institutes

The research institutes of Uzbekistan State World Languages University serve as key platforms for advancing academic research and innovation in linguistics, translation studies, foreign language education, media communication, and social sciences. These institutes play an important role in strengthening the University's scientific potential while supporting the integration of education, research, and innovation.

Established as part of the University's strategic development priorities, the research institutes aim to promote interdisciplinary research, expand international academic collaboration, and contribute to the development of modern language education and cultural studies in Uzbekistan and the broader global academic community.

By bringing together experienced scholars, researchers, and young academics, these institutes support the development of new research projects, scientific publications, and academic initiatives addressing contemporary challenges in language studies, communication, and social development.

Currently, Uzbekistan State World Languages University hosts eight specialised research institutes, each focusing on key academic and scientific areas that contribute to the advancement of knowledge and the preparation of highly qualified specialists in the field of foreign languages and intercultural communication.



Academic Conferences and Research Initiatives

Uzbekistan State World Languages University actively contributes to academic dialogue and research development through the organisation of scientific conferences, research forums, and specialised workshops. These initiatives provide a platform for scholars, researchers, and students to exchange ideas, present research findings, and discuss contemporary challenges related to language education, translation studies, communication, and social development.

During the reporting period, UzSWLU hosted a number of international scientific and practical conferences in collaboration with national and international academic institutions and organisations. These events brought together leading scholars, policy experts, and researchers to explore a wide range of topics, including intercultural communication, linguistic research, translation studies, education policy, digital transformation in education, and sustainable social development.

Academic conferences organised by the University featured expert sessions, panel discussions, and plenary lectures, allowing participants to share research results and develop new academic partnerships. Such events not only contribute to the advancement of scholarly knowledge but also strengthen the University's international academic visibility.

In addition to conferences, UzSWLU research institutes implement various research projects, workshops, and training programmes aimed at promoting evidence-based research, professional development, and interdisciplinary collaboration. These initiatives support young researchers and graduate students by providing opportunities to engage in scientific discussions and participate in international academic networks. Through these academic initiatives, Uzbekistan State World Languages University continues to strengthen its role as an important centre for research, innovation, and international academic cooperation in the fields of foreign languages, linguistics, and intercultural communication.

National Foreign Languages Olympiad

On 26 September, Uzbekistan State World Languages University hosted the Republican Foreign Languages Olympiad among students of higher education institutions across Uzbekistan. The competition brought together talented students from universities throughout the country to demonstrate their knowledge and skills in foreign languages, including English, German, French, Italian, Spanish, Korean, Chinese, Japanese, and Arabic. According to the results of the Olympiad, students from Uzbekistan State World Languages University achieved notable success, securing prize-winning places across several language categories, including French, Italian, Spanish, and Arabic, as well as additional podium positions in other language disciplines.

Student Participation in an International Academic Programme

A fourth-year student of the Faculty of International Journalism, majoring in Political Science, Zilolaxon Komilova, participated in the International Winter School programme “Known and Unknown Latin America”, held on 19–22 November 2024 at the Institute of Psychological and Economic Research (IPEI) in Saratov, Russian Federation.

The student earned the opportunity to participate through an international grant. The programme included lectures and seminars on political systems, economic development models, and contemporary geopolitical challenges in Latin America, providing participants with opportunities to exchange ideas with international experts and students from different countries.

Her participation in this international academic initiative contributed to expanding her research interests, gaining international experience, and strengthening the University’s international academic engagement.



Student Participation in an International Summer Programme

On 13 April 2024, the Rector of Uzbekistan State World Languages University, Ilkhomjon Tuxtasinov, met with a group of students departing to participate in the Summer Camp programme at Liaodong University, China, under the guidance of the Head of the Chinese Language Department.

During the meeting, students were encouraged to effectively utilise the educational opportunities created by the government, represent Uzbekistan and UzSWLU with dignity, and actively enhance their academic knowledge and intercultural competencies while participating in the programme.





Artificial Intelligence and Language Technology Laboratories

Uzbekistan State World Languages University continues to modernise its educational infrastructure through the establishment of advanced Artificial Intelligence, simultaneous interpretation, and phonetic laboratories. These laboratories provide students with opportunities to develop practical language skills using modern digital technologies and innovative teaching tools.

The Artificial Intelligence laboratory supports research and experimentation in language technologies, including speech recognition, automated translation, and digital learning platforms, contributing to the integration of modern technologies into foreign language education. Artificial intelligence tools are increasingly used to enhance language learning, improve writing and communication skills, and support personalised learning environments.

In addition, simultaneous interpretation laboratories allow students to practice professional interpreting skills in conditions similar to international conferences, while phonetic laboratories help learners improve pronunciation, listening comprehension, and speech analysis using specialised linguistic software.

Together, these facilities strengthen the University's capacity to train highly qualified linguists, translators, and international communication specialists equipped with modern technological competencies.

Artificial Intelligence and Language Technology Facilities

Uzbekistan State World Languages University continues to modernise its academic and technological infrastructure by establishing advanced Artificial Intelligence, simultaneous interpretation, phonetics laboratories, and the EduSmart digital studio. These facilities play a crucial role in integrating innovative technologies into the educational process and improving the quality of language education. Through these modern laboratories, students gain practical experience using professional equipment and digital tools that support the development of linguistic, analytical, and technological competencies.

Artificial Intelligence Laboratory

The Artificial Intelligence Laboratory serves as a platform for conducting scientific and practical research in the field of digital technologies and artificial intelligence. The laboratory supports the development and implementation of AI-based tools for language learning, automated translation, speech recognition, and digital communication technologies. The university also organizes training courses dedicated to applying artificial intelligence in foreign language teaching and modern educational methodologies. These initiatives help students and academic staff develop digital competencies and adapt to the rapidly evolving technological environment in higher education.

Simultaneous Interpretation Laboratory

The Simultaneous Interpretation Laboratory provides students with the opportunity to develop professional interpreting skills in conditions that closely simulate international conferences and diplomatic meetings. Equipped with modern interpretation booths, headsets, and specialised software, the laboratory enables students to practice simultaneous and consecutive interpreting techniques. Such practical training plays a significant role in preparing highly qualified interpreters capable of working in international organisations, diplomatic institutions, and global communication environments.

Phonetics Laboratory

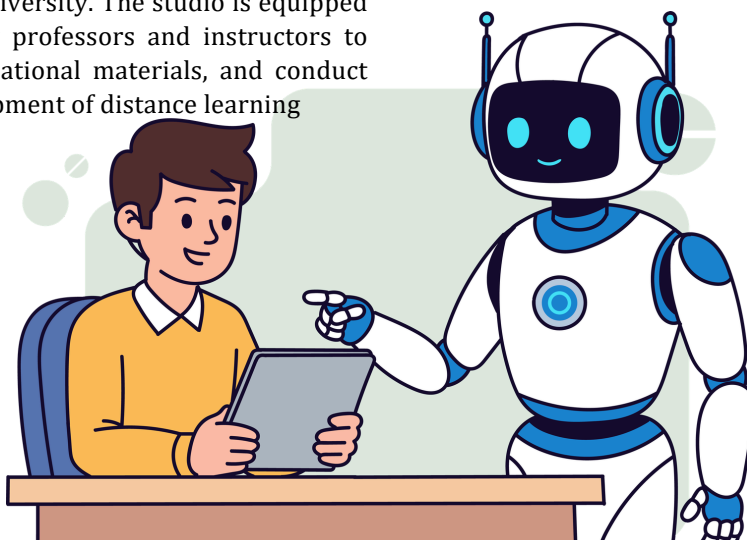
The Phonetics Laboratory focuses on improving students' pronunciation, listening comprehension, and speech analysis skills. Using specialised linguistic software, audio recording technologies, and acoustic analysis tools, students can analyse speech patterns, correct pronunciation errors, and improve their phonetic competence in multiple foreign languages. This laboratory plays an essential role in developing accurate pronunciation and effective oral communication skills, which are fundamental for future linguists, translators, and language teachers.

EduSmart Digital Studio

The EduSmart Studio represents an important step in the digital transformation of education at Uzbekistan State World Languages University. The studio is equipped with modern multimedia technologies that allow professors and instructors to record high-quality lectures, develop digital educational materials, and conduct online classes. Cultural and Student Engagement Activities

The University also supports cultural and entrepreneurial initiatives through facilities such as the University Museum, University Mall, and the “Kulolman” pottery centre, which encourage students’ artistic expression and entrepreneurship. In addition, UzSWLU regularly cooperates with foreign cultural centres and diplomatic missions, organising embassy events, language days, and international cultural programmes that strengthen intercultural dialogue and global cooperation.

International Conferences

Student Competitions

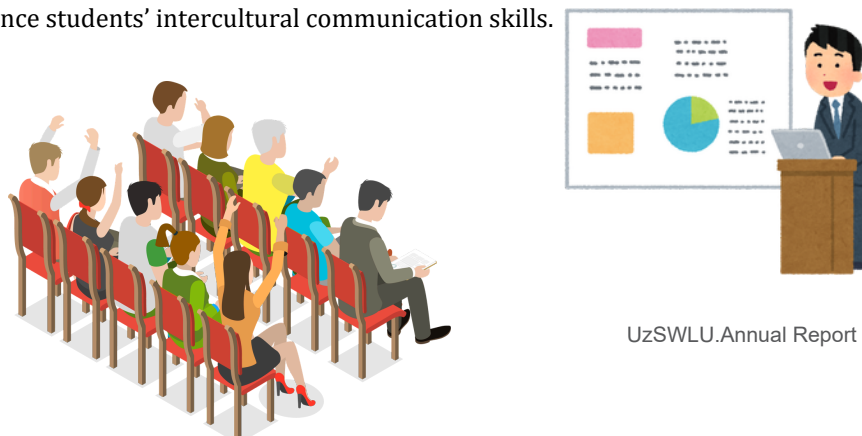

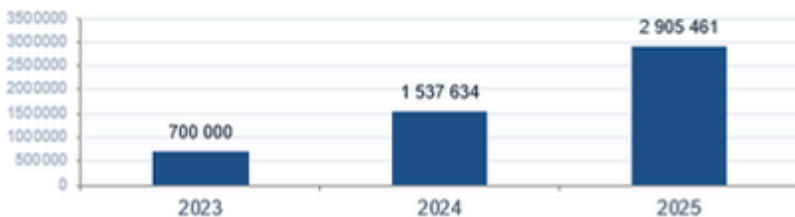

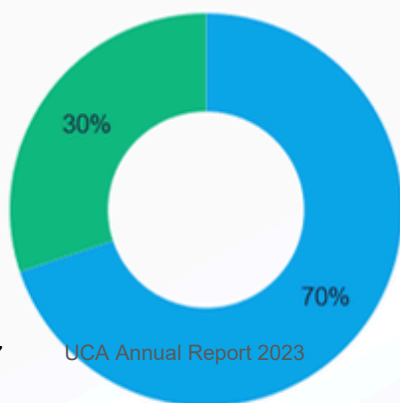

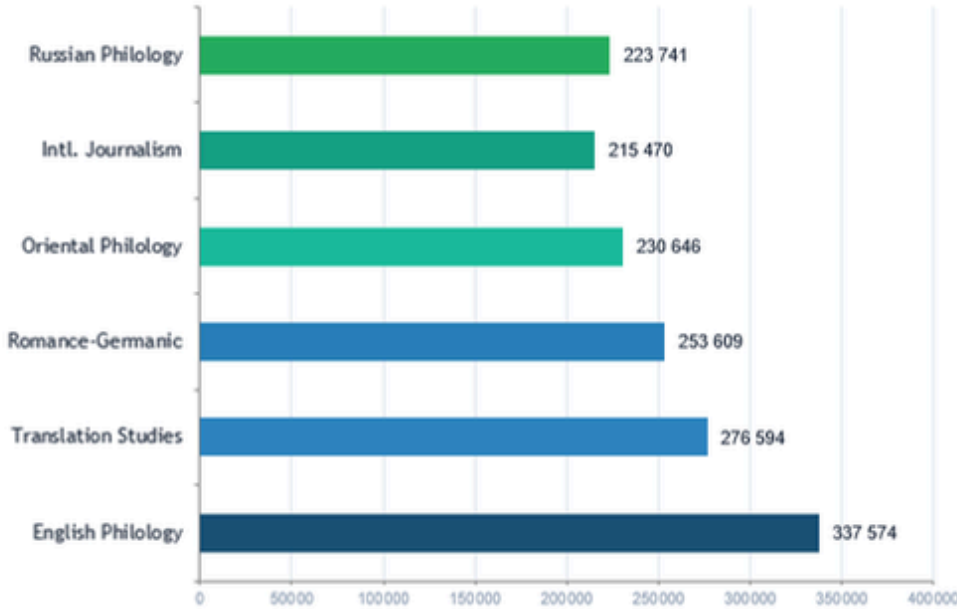
