7.20 LMS-Enabled Digital Literacy Program (GD.12)

Uzbekistan State World Languages University (UzSWLU) promotes digital literacy as a core competency for students, academic staff, and administrative personnel through an integrated Learning Management System (LMS) and institutional digital learning environment. Digital literacy programmes are coordinated by the **Center for Digital Education Technologies**, the **Information Resource Centre (Library)**, the **International Rankings Department**, and the **Department of Sustainability, Environment and Green Innovation (DSEGI)**.

All programmes are delivered through the University's **E-IJRO Learning Management System (LMS)** and support implementation of the **Digital Uzbekistan–2030 Strategy**, the **UzSWLU Digital Transformation Strategy (2023–2027)**, and the University's sustainability objectives.

LMS-Enabled Digital Literacy Programmes

No.	Programme	Target Group	Main Learning Outcomes
1	Digital Literacy Orientation	New students	Introduction to the LMS, digital academic services, e-library resources, academic integrity, responsible use of AI tools, and digital communication.
2	Digital Research Skills	Students and academic staff	Effective use of digital libraries, scientific databases, institutional repositories, citation management, and research information systems.
3	Remote Digital Learning	Students and staff	Secure remote access to institutional learning resources, digital library services, online learning platforms, and research databases.

Description

Digital literacy is integrated into the University's teaching, research, administration, and sustainability activities through the E-IJRO Learning Management System. The LMS provides students and staff with continuous access to online learning materials, digital academic services, research resources, institutional regulations, and sustainability-related training programmes.

The University's digital literacy framework covers responsible use of digital technologies, academic integrity, information literacy, cybersecurity awareness, digital communication, online collaboration, research skills, and sustainability data management. Training is offered through online modules, self-paced courses, workshops, webinars, and blended learning activities.

Particular emphasis is placed on developing competencies required for modern higher education, including responsible use of artificial intelligence, digital research methods, electronic information management, academic honesty, and digital sustainability reporting. These competencies support both academic success and effective participation in the University's digital governance ecosystem.

Institutional Impact

Implementation of LMS-enabled digital literacy programmes has enabled the University to:

- strengthen digital competencies among students and staff;
- improve effective use of digital learning resources;
- support academic integrity and responsible use of AI technologies;
- enhance digital research capacity and information literacy;
- improve cybersecurity awareness and responsible digital behaviour;
- strengthen institutional capacity for digital sustainability management and GreenMetric reporting.
