[6.13] ED.6 Number of Cultural Activities on Campus

Cultural activities are an integral component of student life and community engagement at Uzbekistan State World Languages University (UzSWLU). Throughout the academic year, the University organizes a wide range of cultural events that promote intercultural dialogue, multilingual communication, preservation of cultural heritage, artistic expression, and international cooperation.

As a specialized university for world languages, UzSWLU integrates language learning with cultural exchange through festivals, theatre performances, literary evenings, exhibitions, national heritage celebrations, international cultural weeks, translation events, and student creativity programmes. These activities strengthen intercultural understanding while supporting the University's commitment to sustainable development, global citizenship, and social inclusion.

3. Representative Cultural Activities



UzSWLU organizes cultural activities throughout the academic year across all faculties and campuses.

Representative events include:

National Heritage and Historical Events

- Cultural and educational event dedicated to the **688th Anniversary of Amir Temur**, organized by the Faculty of English Philology with participation of international scholars from Eastern University, Sri Lanka.
- National heritage programmes presenting Uzbekistan's historical figures, traditional customs, handicrafts, folk music, and national costumes.

These activities strengthen historical awareness while promoting intercultural understanding among domestic and international students.

Student Creativity and Innovation

- **Student-Fest Exhibition of Innovative Developments**, organized jointly with the Ministry of Higher Education, Science and Innovation and the Tashkent City Administration, showcasing student innovation, creativity, and entrepreneurship.

Performing Arts and Literature

- **International Theatre Day** celebrations featuring theatre performances, multilingual stage productions, and cultural dialogue.
- Poetry evenings, literary competitions, translation contests, and multilingual artistic performances organized throughout the academic year.

International Cultural Exchange

The University regularly organizes:

- International Cultural Weeks;
- Embassy-supported language and culture festivals;
- Country Days;
- Translation and intercultural communication events;
- International student cultural performances.

These activities provide opportunities for students to experience diverse languages and cultures while strengthening international cooperation.

4. Annual Trend of Cultural Activities

The number of cultural activities increased steadily over the three-year reporting period, reflecting the University's continued investment in intercultural engagement and public participation.

5. Management and Coordination

Cultural activities are coordinated jointly by:

- Ma'naviyat va Ma'rifat Department;
- Faculty cultural committees;
- Student organizations;
- Youth Union (Yoshlar Ittifoqi);
- International Relations Department;
- Faculty-based student clubs and cultural societies.

Annual activity plans are approved before each academic year, while implementation is documented through official reports, university media, faculty records, and event documentation.

6. Institutional Impact

The University's cultural activities have contributed to:

- strengthening intercultural dialogue among students from different linguistic and cultural backgrounds;
- preserving national and international cultural heritage;
- increasing student participation in artistic and cultural activities;
- supporting multilingual communication and cultural diversity;
- expanding cooperation with embassies, cultural centres, and international partners;
- improving community engagement through open cultural events hosted on campus.

These activities contribute particularly to **SDG 4 (Quality Education)**, **SDG 11 (Sustainable Cities and Communities)**, and **SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals)**.

7. Relationship with Other Sustainability Indicators

The **536 cultural activities** reported under this indicator include events organized by **student organizations, academic departments, faculty committees, cultural centres, administrative units, and international partners.**

This indicator therefore measures the University's **overall cultural engagement.**



By contrast, **Indicator ED5** reports **320 sustainability-related activities organized specifically by student organizations**. The two indicators measure different scopes and should not be interpreted as the same dataset.

Conclusion

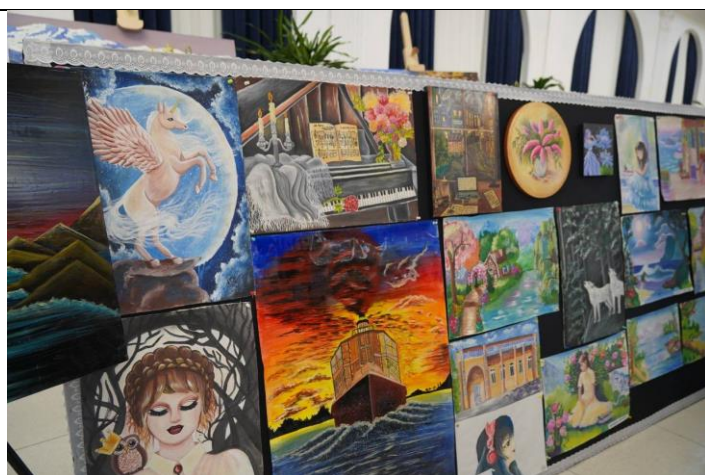
