### [6] Education and Research (ED)

Student organizations at Uzbekistan State World Languages University (UzSWLU) play a central role in promoting sustainability across academic, environmental, social, and community activities. During the **2025–2026 academic year**, student organizations—working in cooperation with the **Youth Union (Yoshlar Ittifoqi)**, the **Ma'naviyat va Ma'rifat Department**, the **International Rankings Department**, and **faculty-based student councils**—organized **320 sustainability-related activities**.

These activities were implemented throughout the academic year across all university campuses and covered four major thematic areas: **eco-environmental action, health and well-being, cultural and educational engagement, and community and international collaboration**, demonstrating the University's systematic approach to student participation in sustainable development.

### 3. Eco-Environmental Actions

Student organizations regularly participate in environmental awareness campaigns, campus greening programmes, waste reduction initiatives, and community clean-up activities.

Major activities include:

- **Waste-Free Day**, organized in cooperation with the Tashkent Department of Ecology and Environmental Protection to promote responsible waste management and zero-waste practices.
- **World Cleanup Day**, implemented jointly with the *Ekolog* Association and the Tashkent City Ecology Department through community plogging and environmental clean-up activities.
- **Save the Planet**, organized by the Faculty of Translation Studies, combining multilingual environmental communication, creative performances, and sustainability awareness.
- **Tree Planting for Peace**, involving regular student participation in campus and community greening initiatives.

These activities provide practical experience in environmental stewardship while strengthening student engagement in biodiversity conservation and sustainable campus development.

### 4. Health and Well-Being

Student organizations promote sustainable lifestyles through activities encouraging physical health, mental well-being, and active mobility.

Key initiatives include:

- **EcoRun – Healthy Lifestyle Marathon**;
- **Valeology and Stress Management Week**;
- **Bike-to-Campus** campaign;
- student sports and community events organized during the World Youth Festival.

These activities contribute to healthy lifestyles while supporting active and low-carbon mobility on campus.

### 5. Cultural and Educational Engagement

Student organizations integrate sustainability into educational and cultural activities through multilingual communication and interactive learning.

Major activities include:

- **Barqaror Til – Barqaror Dunyo** seminar series;



- **EcoTalks and SDG Debate Clubs;**
- **Sustainability Film Week;**
- **EcoPoster Exhibition and Green Poetry Contest.**

These activities encourage critical discussion of environmental, cultural, and social sustainability while strengthening multilingual sustainability communication.

## 6. Community and International Collaboration

Student organizations extend sustainability activities beyond the University through community outreach and international cooperation.

Major initiatives include:

- participation in the **Youth Shoulder Project (Germany)** focusing on ecology, volunteering, and youth leadership;
- sustainability outreach programmes with local schools promoting recycling and environmental responsibility;
- joint activities with the Tashkent Department of Ecology, *Ekolog* NGO, and the Youth Affairs Agency;
- participation in international youth programmes promoting sustainable development and intercultural cooperation.

## 7. Activity Trend

The number of sustainability-related activities organized by student organizations increased from **215** in 2023–2024 to **320** in 2025–2026, demonstrating continuous growth in student engagement with sustainability.

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## 8. Management and Monitoring

Student sustainability activities are coordinated through annual action plans prepared by the Youth Union, faculty-based student councils, and relevant university departments. Activity implementation



is documented through faculty reports, event records, official university media, and annual student organization reports.

This institutional monitoring framework enables the University to evaluate annual progress, ensure continuity, and strengthen student participation in sustainability initiatives.

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## 9. Impact

The continuous expansion of student-led sustainability activities has contributed to:

- increased student participation in environmental and community initiatives;
  - expansion of the Eco-Volunteers Network across faculties and student residences;
  - strengthened cooperation with government agencies, NGOs, schools, and international partners;
  - greater integration of sustainability themes into student clubs, seminars, debates, cultural activities, and volunteer programmes;
  - increased visibility of sustainability initiatives through official university communication channels;
  - stronger student leadership in implementing sustainability projects across the University.
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## 10. Relationship with Other Sustainability Indicators

The **320 activities** reported under this indicator represent **only sustainability-related activities organized or co-organized by student organizations**.

University-wide sustainability events organized by academic departments, research institutes, administrative units, and external partners are reported separately under **Indicator 6.11 (Number of sustainability-related events averaged annually over the past three years)**. Consequently, the figures reported under the two indicators cover different scopes and are therefore not directly comparable.

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## Conclusion

Student organizations play an important role in implementing the University's sustainability strategy through environmental action, health promotion, educational activities, volunteering, and community engagement. Annual planning, institutional coordination, and systematic monitoring ensure that sustainability remains an integral component of student life across all faculties and campuses.

With **320 sustainability-related activities implemented during the 2025–2026 academic year**, UzSWLU demonstrates a structured and institution-wide approach to student engagement in sustainable development.



In connection with the designation of March 30 as Waste-Free Day by the Tashkent Department of Ecology, Environmental Protection, and Climate Change, a clean-up campaign was organized to remove litter collected along the roadsides. This initiative aimed to improve the environment and raise ecological awareness among the public.

As part of the "Youth Shoulder" project organized in Germany, on July 23, 2024, Dilshoda Alisherova, a fourth-year student from the Faculty of English Language and Literature at the Uzbek State University of World Languages, participated in an 8-day training session in the city of Weimar, Germany.

Out of participants from all over Uzbekistan, 25 were selected for the training, during which they received lessons from international trainers in Russian and English on the topics of "Ecology," "Human Rights," and "Volunteering."
